

## FIND YOUR RING SIZE


1. Print this PDF file.

## For the best results, please ensure the following:


- Prior to printing, make sure that the page scaling is set either to 'None', 'Actual Size' or 100% in your printing options.
- Ensure that you print the Ring Sizing Guide on standard A4-size paper.
- Check that the scale bar below measures exactly 50mm after printing.



2. Cut out the ring sizer and carefully cut the slot on the wide end.



3. Place the end of the ring sizer through the slot to make a loop.



4. Wrap the ring sizer around your engagement ring finger, with the marked side visible to you.

Engagement and wedding rings are traditionally worn on the ring finger on the left hand.

5. Tighten the loop until it feels secure.

Your ring should fit your finger comfortably; snug enough so that it will not fall off, but loose enough to slide over your knuckle.


## Finger size can vary depending on the time of day and weather. For best results:

- Measure your finger at the end of the day and when your fingers are warm. (Fingers are smaller early in the morning and when cold).
- Measure your finger size 3 to 4 times to ensure that the reading is as accurate as possible.



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6. Measure your finger, taking the reading from the top of the sizer:



7. The letter marking that is closest to the slit on the wide end of the sizer indicates your ring size.

**Please note:** This Ring Sizer is intended as a guide only and may be subject to inaccuracies dependant on print options, paper type and other factors.
